Didn't that constitute a miracle?

We are witness to so many more miracles than what we actually realise, and I believe it is time for us to start looking for them, and find out through Scripture how to wait on them, what to do when we wait and how all these miracles happen. So I do hope you enjoy the series and have a wonderful Fall and then, just like that, we will be singing Christmas carols. I actually find that exciting!!

It has been a productive summer for the Board this year with some big projects and repairs coming up in the future.

On the Sundays of July 13 and 20, a special collection was taken to help offset the cost of repairs to the damaged eaves troughs along the sides of the sanctuary.

Thanks to the extreme generosity of the congregation a total of \$3470 was raised out of the total cost of \$3445 plus tax. This allowed the board to fully cover the cost of the repairs without affecting the budget set at the beginning of the year.

We are making another application to the Lee and Thora Vance fund this year. We applied for this grant back in 2023 to cover the replacement of the church windows. This year, if we receive the funds, we will be replacing the roof above the furnace room as well as upgrading the wiring in the downstairs kitchen, something that has been requested by several teams in the church.
