As we enter this Advent season, I'm reminded once again that God often speaks through the simple, unexpected moments of life. Just a few weeks ago - being away for yet another hockey tournament - I was buying coffee at a Tim Hortons inside a shopping centre when the power suddenly went out. Seeing that we were inside a shopping centre, no outside light shone in, and it was pretty dark. A few people groaned, and the lady behind the counter apologised as she fumbled under the counter for a flashlight. But then something beautiful happened: one of the customers took out his phone, turned on the flashlight and put it on the counter, for the lady to see what she was doing. Within minutes, others followed his lead with the small lights on their phones. The darkness didn't vanish, but it no longer felt overwhelming.



That moment reminded me of what Advent is truly about. The world into which Jesus was born was spiritually dark, heavy with longing and uncertainty. But God did not wait for perfect conditions to send His Son. He stepped into the darkness Himself - humble, quiet, and seemingly small, yet powerful enough to change everything.

*"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."*

*John 1:1-5*



Our faith centers on this truth: we cannot rescue ourselves. Human effort, good intentions, or moral improvement can't generate the light our souls need. But Christ can. And He has. Advent proclaims the miracle that God came near - not because we were ready, but because we were lost.

In a season where our lives feel rushed, distracted, or stretched thin, the arrival of Jesus invites us to stop striving and receive again the grace that saves and sustains us. Just as those small cellphone flashlights pushed back the darkness in the Tim Hortons, the presence of Christ pushes back the fear, confusion, and burdens we carry.

May His hope brighten your home, His peace steady your steps, and His love shine through you this Advent.



## Saturday, February 28, 2026







## Goforth WMS
